PURPOSE OF THE REPORT:

This report presents a proposal from South East Staffordshire Consortium to develop a local prescribing incentive scheme and pilot on innovation incentive scheme linked to savings

KEY POINTS:

The scheme is additional to and builds on the Quality and Outcomes guidance for prescribing. This scheme has now been split into two elements.

- The first is a quality prescribing incentive scheme. It aims to incentivise more cost effective, quality prescribing. The funding linked to this scheme has been uplifted from £40k to £50k and will be the first call on SESC prescribing savings. The quality element of the proposal was agreed at the meeting on 8 July 2009 at the value of £40k.
- The second scheme is now being described as a pilot innovation incentive scheme based on any actual prescribing savings. It will ensure increased involvement of practices within practice based commissioning and provide a resource, if savings are made, to invest in practices.

The savings sharing scheme is based on notional capping of £200k for both schemes combined. Savings will be shared on a sliding scale of

Any further savings	90 : 10

The practices will need to work on the more difficult prescribing issues as they have

already achieved good performance. They recognise this is a risk sharing scheme and that if no savings are made they will receive nothing.
